Townhouse location makes it a prime choice

CAPE MAY – In the real estate market, location is often cited as the primary quality people look for in a home.

In Cape May, there really doesn't seem to be a bad location, as just about everything is a reasonable walk or short bike ride away.

This is no less true at 516 Broad St., Cape May, this week's House of the Week. This townhouse/condo is located just a couple blocks from the Washington Street Mall and the central business district, yet tucked away in a private location.

"It's a lovely side-by-side townhome," said Carol Menz of Coastline Realty. "It's one block off the back side of the Washington Street Mall – it's a really a great location."

Menz said the home is located approximately five blocks from the beach, and closer to shopping, church, dining and entertainment.

"And it's in a great location to West Cape May and all it has to offer," she said. "It's rather remote...the neighbor has open lot, but it is tucked away – little quiet – not the highest volume destination area, but it is close to everything."

According to Menz, the home is being sold mostly furnished, less some personal items.

"It's a lovely home – the owners had a taste for the beach," she said. "And it's ready for move in. You are not going to have to lift a finger when you enter this property."

The first floor, she said, has an open floor plan with kitchen living space on first floor. The kitchen features high-end, stainless steel appliances and granite countertops.

There is a deck off the kitchen for relaxing and getting away from the hustle and bustle of the downtown while being just a stone's throw away. Menz said the one-car attached garage is a great, safe storage place for kayaks, bikes, beach chairs, and other necessary beach items.

"The garage space is certainly a bonus in town," she said.

The first floor of the house also has one



of the four bedrooms.

"The first floor has what I would call a master bedroom with full bath," Menz said.

The bedroom has access to a full bath from the room, and there is also an ac
