Location is everything on Second Avenue

CAPE MAY – Realtors everywhere talk about location, location, location – it being the primary definition of home value.

ing on the state park beaches. From a second floor deck, there is an unparalleled view of the Nature Conservancy and state park. The next owner will be able to sit on the deck and watch any variety of ducks and other waterfowl landing in a pond located just beyond the property line.

Scanning over the meadows, one can see the Cape May Point Lighthouse and enjoy its lightshow each night and as it marks land for passing boats. During the day, view the beaches where the ocean and bay meet. During the night experience sunsets from the comfort of your own deck.

What's more, being located adjacent to preserved parkland, your view will never change, with the exception of seasonal colors.

The house itself is something special. Walk in the front door and you are faced with a fully enclosed porch for enjoying summer light and breezes. One of the most remarkable features about the first floor is the abundance of windows, which allow in southern light and ocean breezes. The windows contribute to the open, flowing floor plan of this house. Standing in the kitchen area, one can look back through the dining room and living room, and vice versa, and feel the roominess and flow.

One will also notice the 1930s era craftsmanship in woodwork surround
