open at 3:30 p.m. Tourgoers may want to take a quick look and make arrangements to return for a more in-depth visit at a later date.

This year's featured house is The Jonathan and Sarah James House.

The house was built about 1860 in a vernacular interpretation of the Greek Revival style. The main portion of this two-story frame house is three bays wide and two bays deep with a center entrance. The side-gabled roof has overhanging eaves and a boxed cornice with returns in the gable ends. The eaves are decorated with circa 1890 flat jigsawcut trim in a teardrop shape. The front door has a surround of reeded pilasters that support a cornice with a dentiled pediment. Of special interest to visitors is the side sunroom with its many multipaned windows. The house has survived the foreclosure process and its new owners are giving it plenty of well-deserved attention.
