

Free Fitness Walk at Two Mile Beach

WILDWOOD CREST – The Friends of Cape May National Wildlife Refuge will present a special free Saturday Fitness Walk, Dec. 14, 2 to 3 p.m., at the Two Mile Beach Unit of the Refuge. Get ready for all those upcoming holiday calories with a nice, well-paced walk at this beautiful location. The walk will start with a short but slightly challenging sandy trail through the dunes to the beach. Then it's down the beach for about a half mile to the Cold Spring Jetty, where you might see some interesting winter birds and animal tracks. We will continue back along the beach to the midpoint observation platform, where we'll take the boardwalk trail back to the Visitor Contact Station. Total distance will be about two miles, at a pace of approximately 20 min/mile (with some short breaks if needed). Let's get a nice group of walkers together and make this a regular weekly event. There are several alternate routes to explore here. This walk is free and open to the public. No pre-registration is required. As always, dress for the weather. If it's breezy, the beach can be colder than inland; wear gloves and ear warmers. Heavy rain or snow cancels the event. After the walk, the public is invited to warm up in the newly-opened Nature Store at Two Mile. Please meet at the Visitors Contact Station at the Two Mile Beach Unit of Cape May National Wildlife Refuge, 12001 Pacific Ave (Ocean Dr), Wildwood Crest, near the former Coast Guard Loran Station. Kearney Street home is what Cape May is about

CAPE MAY – This week's House of the Week, 832 Kearney Ave., is located in the heart of Cape May's Historic District, which means it has everything people are looking for in a home in Cape May.

This three story, cedar shake cottage has five bedrooms, which includes a third floor, one-bedroom suite with its own entrance.

"It's licensed as a duplex," said John McBride, sales associate with Coldwell Banker Sol Needles Real Estate.

McBride said this home would appeal to the next owner primarily as a single family home.

"It has a really big side yard, which is perfect for hosting barbecues or family events," he said.

McBride said the large side yard is probably undervalued by most estimates.

"I think if you enjoy the ocean, you would enjoy being outdoors, and you would love this yard space," he said. "It's a true compliment to this property."

McBride said 832 Kearney is "nestled" in the Historic District, which means it is settled and comfortable there, not on the fringes or on the thoroughfares. Kearney is a residential street, lined with some of the prime historic homes in Cape May.

"This home will really be for someone who likes the style of the older homes," McBride said.

When one enters the house the character of a historic home is immediately revealed by the original hardwood floors and the solid wood molding, which suggests the strength and quality construction of a historic home.

"It's got charm," McBride said, pointing out some original doors, the smaller, multiple windowpanes.

"It has a cottage look from the street," he said.
