hot dogs," Doran said, while his daughters remember the sundaes, peppermints and buttercremes. They also remember spending time at Frank's Playland across from

Sid's (Carney's).

"Dad would give us a quarter and we would go play skeeball," Mary said.

Doran said Frank was always nice to the kids and

always nice to the kids, and would sometimes give them slugs to allow them to play longer, while dad and his brothers had a beer or two at Sid's. On Sundays the family would attend church at Our Lady Star of the Sea and later get hot cross buns or creamfilled doughnuts from Kokus's Bakery (now La Patisserie). They got meats from Harry's Market, where Doran, at age 14, drove a delivery truck for Harry Reeves. The family would also go to McPherson's Dairy on Shunpike Road for butter-

The children remember

playing in the abandoned Physick Estate during visits to Cape May.

One place they did not go was Wally's, which sold newspapers, magazines, tobacco products, and candy. Kathleen said at times the kids would try to buy some candy, keeping their heads down to avoid being recognized; but when they were, they heard, "No Dorans!" and shown the door.

The family was always welcome at 38 Jackson, now the Prince Edward Inn, which they all knew simply as "38." The third floor held two double beds and two single beds, which would sleep all the children. According to the Doran kids, as many as 39 people at one time, including aunts, uncles and cousins, stayed at 38. Dave Doran grew up as one of nine children in 38 Jackson.

During the day the kids would go to the beach, returning to Jackson Street for lunch. Then every night they were on the boardwalk. Their



mother would read to them night every after returned home.

The kids looked forward to staying at their grandmother's house for these reasons, but also because they could get whole milk (instead of powdered), "Cape May butter," rather than margarine, and Jersey corn and tomatoes. There, grandmother was always a fixture in the kitchen, much like the heavy wooden table that was there, because of all the house

"The table was where we hung out," Kathleen said.
She said she remembers

times, laughing so hard, while they played games like, "Whisper Down the Lane." Grandmother would also

make gallons of strong iced tea. She also made a dish they called "Rubberneck," which was ground sirloin, browned and added to a cream sauce and served over mashed pota-

The family eventually had their own home in Cape May at 1130 Washington St., which allowed them to stay the entire summer.

Eventually the moved to upstate New York. Their mother grew up in Hall, N.Y., and longed to return.



The daughters married local boys and for the most part stayed in New York, with the exception of Mary, who has lived in Amsterdam for 30 years. Kathleen is currently in Landstuhl, Germany, where she helped set up a

trauma center for soldiers injured in Iraq Afghanistan.

"They will be address any areas that may have settled and finish the paving work," he said.
