CAPE MAY — Captain Stan Hansen has been promoted to serve as Port Captain for the Cape May-Lewes Ferry. Hansen, who has more than 40 years of experience in the maritime industry, began his official duties Nov. 3, according to a news release.


Hansen joined the Cape May-Lewes Ferry as an able-

During his tenure, Hansen also has served as the MV American River Project Captain in 1997, led the Lewes Terminal Finger Pier Docking Project in 2000 and reorganized and revamped the Three Forts Ferry operations in 1998. Prior to joining the ferry, Hansen owned and operated five commercial fishing vessels.

He holds numerous maritime licenses, including Inland Unlimited Tonnage Masters license, First Class Pilot of Any Gross Tons upon the Lower Delaware Bay and a Master of 500 Gross Tons near Coastal Waters. A lifelong Cape May County resident, Hansen resides in North Cape May with his wife, Christine.

Van Drew said that in a time

of trouble and political strife, it was good to know "there are good, simple, decent people that love other people and care."

He said he looked forward to attending Holloway's Eagle Scout Court of Honor.

"We are truly blessed when people come together and do the right thing," Lower Township

Manager Mike Voll said.

Laurie Johnson, director of Family Promise, said Holloway's backyard play area project was an answer to prayers.

According to its website, in its first four and a half years, Family Promise of Cape May County has hosted 35 families consisting of 47 adults and 74 children. An additional 121 individuals were served food, given holiday gifts and connected to support services for their immediate needs.

Family Promise is a program designed to help families with children who are experiencing homelessness. A network of faith communities and more than 1,000 volunteers provide temporary housing and meals for as many as four families at a time, a maximum of 14 people.

Families in the program receive full-time case management to assist with overcoming the causes that led to their homelessness.
