TOWN BANK – Often, when people are choosing a home at the shore, one of the things they are looking for is a place where they can relax and enjoy being at the shore - even if the home was de-

signed for year round living. One of the first things real estate bro-ker Carol Menz thinks of when asked about 805 Shore Road is that it is a maintenance-free home on the outside.

"There is not lot of outdoor maintenance. There is a stone yard with bay-

front tolerant landscaping," she said. This is a good thing, because the next owners will want to spend their free time taking in the view from the Delaware Bay just across the street.

"The view is spectacular. There is nothing in front of you but the bay," she said. "It's a nice corner location with privacy on both sides.'

Menz said the home fronts on the bay but does not sit in dunes.

"It's not in a flood zone," she said. This short section of Shore Road is a dead end Menz called "the quiet section of Town Bank away from hubbub.

According to Menz, the home was built for active people who needed storage space for their things. The home has a two-car garage with room behind the garage to store a boat and trailer. The current owners had an RV.

The living area of the home was also designed with space in mind.

"It has a nice open floor plan...the whole front of house – first floor kitchen, dining area, living room with fireplace all open deck space in front," she said.

There is also a second floor living room along with a master bedroom with bath and closet. There is also what Menz called a "mini-master" on second floor with private bath as well.

The downstairs also has two bedrooms and a full bath. The kitchen has a bayfront view, so one can prepare dinner and enjoy the scenic view.
