### Historic home has plenty of room to spare

CAPE MAY – Originally a 15-room summer cottage, 238 Perry St. is now a six bedroom, six bath private home.

In between, it was operated for 21 years as a bed and breakfast known as the Barnard Good House.

Constructed in either 1863 or 1875, the house was moved during the Johnson administration (Andrew, not Lyndon) to its present location.

The three-story home was converted from a single family home, which accounts all six of the bedrooms having its own bathroom – most of them located in the room. One second floor bedroom has a hall bathroom.

Listing agent Dee Lanzalotti said when the property was converted to a B&B the owners created six parking spots on the side of the house. The parking today is a premium for the next owner and guests.

Entering from the side, one steps into the kitchen with its center counter and modern appliances. The kitchen contains a large, original cupboard. Replacement cupboards were selected to match the original woodwork.
