507 Madison Ave. a good place to start

CAPE MAY – Realtor Todd deSatnick said if someone is looking to become a Cape May homeowner, 507 Madison Ave. would be a good place to start.

A single-family ranch-style home with two bedrooms and one bath, deSatnick said this home has the potential to be more.

"There is the potential to remodel the office back to the original design as a third bedroom, and there is the potential to create a second bathroom in the generously-sized laundry area," he said. Located at the corner of Madison and

Located at the corner of Madison and Ohio avenues, deSatnick said the home is close to beaches and downtown. He said the home has been meticulously maintained. The home being approximately 50 years old, it has both hardwood and tile floors, accentuated with granite countertops. Climate controlled with central heat-

Climate controlled with central heating and air-conditioning, 507 Madison has a living room facing Madison Avenue and a sunroom in the rear.

"It has an efficient floor plan, it?s bright, and it has an attic with plywood flooring for storage," deSatnick said. The home also has a detached one-

The home also has a detached oneand-a-half car garage for your vehicle and/or beach gear. There is also offstreet parking in the driveway, always a bonus anywhere in Cape May.

deSatnick said the pavered patio in rear is suitable for entertaining, barbecues, etc. He said the relatively smaller sized landscaped and grass area means a lower level of maintenance yard maintenance, which is a big plus for second home owners.

"It has manageable grass and gardens area for lower maintenance," he said. The house is being sold with appli-
