Devonshire condo offers ease of living

Most people visiting Cape May believe Lafayette Street ends at Colliers Liquor Store. South Layette continues from Perry Street to Grant Street.

According to Vogel, about 10-12 years ago the original structure burned down on that property. She said a Victorianstyle condominium complex was built to replace it.

to replace it. "That means everything, the electric, the plumbing, it's all up to code," she said.

Vogel said the owners purchased the property before the fire intending to use it when they could in the off season, and rent it in season. She said they are ready to move on, and the unit can be a source of rental income for the next owner.

"It's perfect, it's close to the beach and mall. The building is about 12 years old, so there is nothing you have to do," she said.

Vogel said some older units have special assessments for roof, siding or whatever. She said this condo comes with fees of just \$665 per quarter.

"Which is very reasonable for Cape May...and what you get," she said.

Vogel said this is a two-level condo, with three bedrooms and two-and-ahalf baths.
