sponses from residents, second home owners and visitors. She said 45.4% of respondents were yearround residents while 43% were second home owners.

"Definitely, the females were much more interested in responding at a rate of 69.2% as opposed to 28.2% male and again those of us who are up there in years, 61 plus, 58.2% responded and the next largest group is the 41- to 60-year-old re-

sponse," Cohen said. She thanked Cape May MAC (Museums + Arts + Culture) for helping distribute the library survey and Cape May's Director of Civic Affairs and Recreation Kacie Rattigan for compiling the information.

The number one response was using the former library for fitness classes followed by using the space for historical and musical programs, children, family, and senior programs.

Respondents also suggested using the building for author/lecture series, adult, and children's art ficer, and county Library Magariel said.
