# City receives infrastructure grant

CAPE MAY — The city received a \$400,000 check from the county to be used for infrastructure projects, part of \$6.4 million in grant

awards to all county mu-

nicipalities. The \$400,000 per municipality grants are to be used for priority drinking water, storm water, and sanitary sewer infrastructure projects in each of the 16 municipalities in the county.

Cape May County Commission Director Leonard C. Desiderio visited Cape May City Council on May 16, stating municipal government and county government should work together a lot better than they had in the past.

"I've always felt that the county government is just an extension of municipal government, so your problems are our problems," he said. "As Cape May City goes, Cape May County goes and the same with the other 15 municipalities in our county.'

Desiderio proposed four meetings per year with mayors, round table discussions of what's taking place in the county. He said a town may not have the same problem as another municipality today but in the future, it may come about

Municipalities are eligible for a county grant for infrastructure projects such as road construction. Cape May passed with "fly-

ing colors," he said. Council members lined up for a photo with DesidAndrew Bulakowski and County Administrator Kev-

Zack Mullock Mayor thanked the county for the check. He said it was clear that Desiderio has served as mayor based on the meetings he put together.
