
The sale will in-clude men's, women's and children's clothing and accessories, along with household items, linens and books. Proceeds from the sale will benefit outreach projects.

# amenities on Washington St.

CAPE MAY — A classic piece of Cape May history has come on the market, offering a porch-front view of Washington Street and plenty of modern comforts throughout the beautifully updated and maintained property.

The 2,090-square-foot Ann Ware House at 1142 Washington St. was built around 1880. The two-story single has a large lot with plenty of trees and a covered front porch. There are no steps from the porch to the sidewalk — you reach it from inside the house — with the front door set off to the side.

In the very walkable historic district, the house is close to the popular Emlen Physick Estate, renovated and preserved by the Mid-Atlantic City for the Arts and Humanities. A short white-picket fence lines the front, where there's a narrow front yard.

There is plenty of parking in a gravel drive to the side of the house, which
